



Mrs. Letha Griggs Barnhill

February 13, 1926 - November 26, 2019

Funeral services for Mrs. Letha Griggs Barnhill, 93, will be held at 11:00 am on Saturday, November 30th, 2019 at the North Hartsville Baptist Church. The family will receive friends from 4:00 pm until 6:00 pm on Friday, November 29th, 2019 at the Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Home. Mrs. Barnhill died peacefully on Tuesday, November 26, 2019. Born in Chesterfield County, SC, she was a daughter of the late William Henry Griggs and Jessie Viola Griggs.

Letha Mary Griggs "The Pecan Lady" Barnhill

I was born in Chesterfield County on Saturday, February 13, 1926. My parents had twelve children so I always said: "I was one of a dirty dozen". I was the oldest daughter but the fourth in birth order. I attended school at Catpond school in Patrick, SC. The area derived its name because at one time there was a pond that contained a supply of catfish. At an early age, I learned the value of hard work. I was given age-appropriate chores and responsibilities. I had to perform numerous farm-related duties. Over a period of time, I learned to milk cows, plow with mules, plant gardens, work, and harvest vegetables. I was required to pick cotton, sucker tobacco, and crop tobacco. I learned to perform household chores, one of which was ironing without an electric iron. Since I was the first girl I had to assist with caring for my younger siblings as they came along. Caring for my younger siblings would come in handy later in life. After I married, I helped supplement my husband's income by caring for other people's children as well as my own.

Getting back to my farm-related duties, I hated suckering tobacco. I often said, "I'd rather crop than sucker tobacco any day". Farm labor was difficult, but we always had food to eat, even during the depression. If our electric bill exceeded \$1.00 my father would admonish us for wasting electricity. It was hard to exceed \$1.00 when we only had a bulb hanging from the ceiling by an electrical cord.

I would like to inform you a little about my parents. William Henry Griggs and Jessie Viola Griggs. They were loving and hard-working people. My father demanded respect for himself and my mother. When one of us children was disrespectful we felt the wrath of Will or "Ola" Griggs in an authoritative manner. This was not abuse, but a demonstration of love. As I recall, not one in our sibling group spent a minute in jail or was arrested for

anything other than a traffic ticket. I feel this was a result of what was demanded and expected of us. When I was twelve years old, my baby brother Ray died in my arms four days shy of his second birthday. He had pneumonia and I can honestly say this was a very heartbreaking event.

I almost was non – existent (as well as my eleven siblings). Our father was scheduled to be placed on the front lines in France during World War I. He would have perished in battle along with his fellow patriots had he not contracted pneumonia and been hospitalized prior to being sent to the front lines. My father did recover to fight, however, he was exposed to some mustard gas and suffered the residual effects of that chemical. He was left with severe asthma which caused severe breathing problems. He had to sleep outside in a room constructed for him on our front porch. Because of his military service, “Pa” spent three years at a VA hospital most of which were in Oteen, NC. My mother spent most of her time with him at the hospital to make sure he received proper care. She only left his side for brief visits home until his death.

My mother could pick 100 pounds of cotton a day and as hard as I tried I could never match her cotton-picking skills. When the children would go to the fields to work, my mother would prepare food for us children and the hired hands alike. She showed us all the same considerations and no one went without. My mother sewed our clothes and patched them. We wore them until they were worn out. She handed down our clothes until you could read a newspaper through them or they could no longer be mended. My parents met my needs and a few of my wants, (very few) but I learned the meaning of sufficiency accompanied by gratitude and thankfulness.

When my father became ill, I went to work to send money home for food and expenses. I worked at Sonoco during World War II. I also worked at the Boyd – Powe Drug Store lunch counter and made the pimento cheese from scratch. Many years later, I had friends ask me to make them a “batch of that good old Boyd – Powe pimento cheese”. After school, some children would visit the lunch counter and ask for a cherry Pepsi. I would have to put cherries in each Pepsi because they would say, “It’s not a cherry Pepsi if it doesn’t have a cherry in it”.

I married Cole L. Barnhill on December 4, 1955. He asked me out several times and I always declined until he “wore me down”. On the day of our first date, he was playing in a softball game. He lost track of time and his friends reminded him of his date. He left the game, went home and washed off with soap and water from the garden hose because he didn’t have time to take a proper shower.

Cole L. and I operated the Dogwood Inn for a short time and then I became a full-time housewife. I raised my children and had a hand in raising many other children. Some of the children I cared for were relatives and some were total strangers when they came to me. All the children I cared for are special to me and I love them as I love my own.

I have done a lot of things and been several places. I’ve visited Canada, The Bahamas

and been as far west as Missouri. I've even taken in a few Braves games and a Saints/Falcons game. I'm not the most traveled person but I've had fun, heartaches, sickness, health and some joyous times. One thing I am proud of is that I'm a charter member of North Hartsville Baptist Church. Also, my husband and my son purchased some land in Chesterfield county which has some pecan trees on it and they later purchased some used pecan shelling equipment. I learned how to operate the shelling equipment when my husband became ill and later passed away. I have shelled pecans for hundreds of people, not only in South Carolina, but North Carolina and even Georgia. That is why I am referred to as "The Pecan Lady" by my customers. Years ago, The Florence Morning News even featured me in an article which was accompanied by a picture of me holding some pecans after the shelling process. There is a copy of the picture on the wall at the shelling site. I rode ramrod over the shelling crew while my health allowed me.

I was predeceased by my parents and my husband. I was also predeceased by my siblings, Ray Eugene Griggs, James Alexander Griggs, Horace Nichols Griggs, Carrie Margaret Aiken, Howard Bernice Griggs, William David Griggs, and Raymond Randolph Griggs.

I am survived by my daughters, Lynn Barnhill and Hope Barnhill Howle and my son, William Lucas (Martha) Griggs, my sisters, Helen Viola Griggs Byrd and Beulah Frances Griggs Chapman and my brothers, Olin Hewitt Griggs and Harvey Laverne Griggs. I also am survived by my granddaughters, Amanda Griggs (Brad) Jones and Jessica Howle (Ryan) West, two great-grandchildren, Kendall Jones, Addison Jones, two step-granddaughters, Eileen (David) Anderson and Beth (Cliff) Jones and four step-grandchildren. In addition, I leave a host of nieces, nephews, in-laws, and cousins. Others who survive me are T. J., Justin and Tyler Beasley.
