Mrs. Macy Privette Boyd Turner, at the age of 98, quietly rejoined her Lord Tuesday morning, May 18, 2020. The Rev. Steve Winburn will officiate a private graveside service. Macy was born in Lydia, SC on November 30, 1921, one of twelve children to the late Leon Wallace Privette and Katie Sansbury Privette. She was predeceased by ten of her siblings and is survived by her sisters, Betty Fink (C.R.) and Janice Fields.

Macy lived a long, full and purposeful life. She loved the Lord and the church and held several positions as a kindergarten teacher. Macy was known as a loving, kind, generous and caring person; she especially loved children. All that crossed her path remember her as a very special lady.

Macy was married to Hal H. Boyd and had two sons, Hal and James (Jimmy); upon Hal's death she married Fred P.
