Michael (Mike) Alan Jackson died on December 25, 2019, at McLeod Hospital in Florence after a brief and unexpected illness. He is survived by Janel, his wife; Amanda, his daughter; and 2 grandchildren Jackson and Dillon; as well as other family, friends, and his dog, Kylie. Although there is a pet cat in the home, Mike did not consider the cat his friend. His request was not to have a funeral or service and after cremation his ashes to have a final resting place in Key West. Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Home is caring for the family.

Mike was adopted as an infant by Leeman & Sarah Maye Jackson and raised on a farm in Iowa. He graduated from Sidney High School in 1972. He completed a BA in History in 1978 from Nebraska Wesleyan University and obtained a Masters in Education in Career Guidance & Counseling in 1990 from Northern Montana College. He was in the Air Force for 14 years and almost 20 years of employment with the US Government. With his job as a logistician, he was able to travel within the US as well as to several foreign counties. Over the course of these years, he met many people and long-time friendships endured. He loved his family and friends and never met a stranger as he would strike up a conversation everywhere we went. It is hoped those who knew Mike have some funny stories, so please remember those good times.

Mike married Janel Merial in 1977 and together had one daughter, Amanda. Amanda and her children-Jackson and Dillon-reside in Michigan. Mike and Janel moved to Hartsville in January 2016 after their retirement. Mike loved music, golfing, smoking his cigar with friends, college football, and his dogs over the years. He was an active member of the American Legion Post 274 in Lusby, Maryland as well as Post 53 here in Hartsville.
