Mr. Alan Ginn Lewis, 88, the widower of Deborah Thompson Lewis, died peacefully on Thursday, December 8, 2016. Al Lewis lived an extraordinary life. Born in 1928, he filled his almost 89 years actively pursuing his passions, aided and fueled by the love of his life Deborah Thompson Lewis. He, like so many of his generation, answered the call to duty by joining the Navy at 17 in 1945 in the waning days of WWII. He would go on to earn his wings and become a Naval Aviator like his father. After his service, he moved to Aspen, Colorado where he was a member of the Aspen Ski Patrol for years before returning to New England to pursue various business interests, marry his love, raise his family, and engage in the public service of the community they loved so well. He and Debbie would eventually move back to the Rocky Mountains and Telluride, Colorado where they indulged their love of the mountains and continued their lives of public service to their new community. Al's passion for his family, for travel, for aviation, for the mountains and skiing, for his country and the public service that sustains it, were his life's work. He will be missed for his warm smile, generous spirit, caring, thoughtful nature, as well as his wry sense of humor and "ice-breaker" jokes. He lived a very full life, gave generously of himself, was well loved and will be sorely missed.
