She also cherished time with her family and loved cheering on Clemson sports—rarely missing an opportunity to support the Tigers. Anna loved to paint, especially with her friends. You could find her paintings all over her house and in the homes of people she loved. She was known for her bridge card skills both in Bishopville and at Foothills Retirement Community.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her beloved husband of 64 years, Archie H. Chandler Jr.; and her siblings: Billy K. Phillips (Virginia), Clarence “Red” Phillips Jr. (Elina), Ashton Phillips (Lavonne), Jane Hodge (Norman), and Carolyn Hendrickson (Charles).

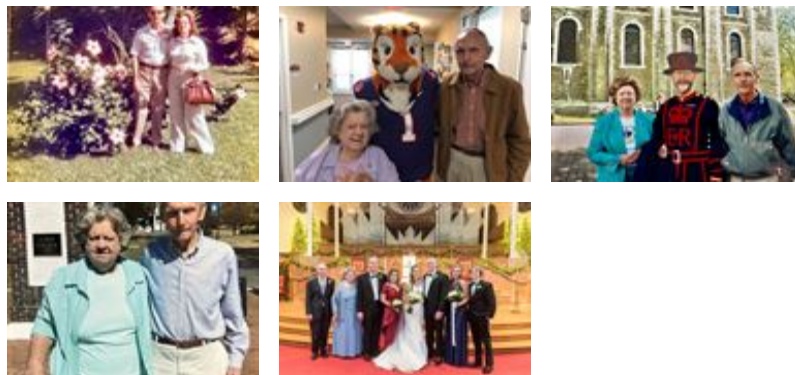
