August 18, 1918 - October 6, 2011

Alice Camille Hodge Thrailkill, 93, went home to her Lord and Savior on October 6, 2011. Born on August 18, 1918, in Alcolu, Clarendon County, SC, she was the loving daughter of the late Patrick Arthur Hodge and Nelle Eugenia Hodge. She was preceded in death by one sister, Mary Patricia Hodge Bagnal of Manning, SC and four brothers; Wylie Arthur Fort Hodge of Alcolu, SC, Richard Dudley Hodge of Lake City, SC, Jack DuPre Hodge of Clemson, SC and Douglas DuPre Hodge of Panama City, FL.

She enjoyed working in her yard and garden. She moved to Simpsonville, SC in 2002.
