



The Rev. Canon Michael Taylor Malone Ph.D.

February 5, 1937 - December 31, 2023

With deep sorrow, Ann Huntley Malone and her family announce the passing of her beloved husband, The Reverend Canon Michael T. Malone, Ph.D., 86.

Canon Malone entered into rest on Sunday, December 31, 2023. Care is being provided to the family by the Directors of Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Home.

A funeral service to honor his life will be held at 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, January 6, 2024, in Saint Bartholomew's Episcopal Church, with the Reverend Michael Bye and The Reverend William D. "Bill" Oldland officiating. The family will receive friends at a joyful reception in the Fellowship Hall immediately following the service.

Born on February 5, 1937, in Roxboro, NC, the son of the late Wilmer Ellis Malone and the late Alice Taylor Malone Twiddy, Canon Malone was raised in Edenton, NC, and graduated from Duke University in 1959, from the Virginia Theological Seminary in 1962, and from Duke University with a Ph.D. degree in 1970.

Ordained in 1962, he served churches in North Carolina, Florida, and South Carolina, including fourteen years as rector of St. Bartholomew's Church in Hartsville, SC. Prior to his retirement, Mike served for fourteen years as Canon to the Ordinary for the Diocese of South Carolina under Bishop

Edward L. Salmon, Jr.

In addition to his lifetime of service with the Church, Mike played four instruments and was an avid golfer who coordinated annual golf trips and bi-annual "Cranmer Cup" trips where U.S. and Canadian clergy squared off against Irish and British clergy.

He is survived by his loving wife, Ann, formerly of Cheraw, SC; daughter Kathryn Lemon (sons Martyn and Jonathan); sons, Daniel (sons Christopher and George) and Michael (wife Abbe, sons Gabriel, Mackenzie, Colton).
