Coy Robbins was born on December 13, 1942, the second youngest of William and Bessie Robbins' nine children in Salisbury, NC. He married Glenda Clawson on January 5, 1963 and later the pair were blessed with two sons, Coy Lee Robbins Jr. in February of 1964 and Christopher Mark Robbins in June of 1973.

Coy worked in the textile industry for nearly 50 years all across the southern United States where he was a well respected supervisor until his retirement several years ago. Mr. Robbins loved to fish, loved all sports, and he loved the outdoors, as long as it was above 50 degrees. He was a highly accomplished golfer who won quite a few golf tournaments across North and South Carolina and Virginia while carrying a zero handicap for much of his playing days even though he never picked up a golf club until the age of twenty-two. But Coy's favorite pastime was without question fishing. He had fished in tournaments for years and had decided to settle his family on Lake Robinson in 1988 after many years of vocational moves so that he and his family could enjoy a simpler life on the lake. Coy could be found fishing off his dock at 5 in the

morning almost any day of the week or cruising from fishing spot to fishing spot, many of which were his secret fishing holes only revealed to a select few. And he enjoyed sharing his love of fishing with his family, neighbors, and friends, inspiring many of them both young and old to share in his passion as well. Coy was also a loving Grandpa. He loved watching his oldest grandchild, Tiffany grow as a golfer and into a young woman and he loved getting to know the three little ones from California who knew him simply as Poppa Robbins and couldn't wait for him to teach them how to fish.

Coy is survived by his lovely wife Glenda, his sons Coy Lee Jr. (Shawn) Robbins and Chris (Kiyoko) Robbins, his grandchildren Tiffany, Doran, Brynn, and Kinsley as well as his siblings, Johnie Robbins and Hazel Jones, preceding him in death and surviving Joe Robbins, Benny Robbins, Doris Barbee, Ora Honeycutt, Margie Hartley, and Mary Ann Adams.
