



Dorothy H. Rowe

Mrs. Rowe, widow of E. Riley Rowe, died Friday, February 15, 2008. Born in Mishawaka, IN, she was a daughter of the late Rev. Dr. Earl F. Hine and the late Mabel Jordan Hine. She was a graduate of Charity Hospital in New Orleans where she was a nursing staff supervisor and a psychiatric nurse. Mrs. Rowe also attended Louisiana State University. She was a member and served on the board of directors of the American Red Cross, Hartsville Chapter in which she was Volunteer of the Year twice, served as Nursing Chair, and volunteer for the Bloodmobile. She was active with the Hartsville Museum where she was co-author of the J. L. Coker booklet and was selected Volunteer of the Year in 1994. She was an advocate of the Kalmia Arts Festival and a faithful volunteer for many years. She also served as a Nursing Instructor at Byerly Hospital and Hartsville High. Mrs. Rowe was an active, life-long member of her church Wesley United Methodist Church where she faithfully served on the Administrative Board, Altar Guild and Council of Ministries. She also served as Girl Scout and Cub Scout Leader. She truly

was a remarkable woman who gave of her time and talent to this community. Surviving are her sons and daughters-in-law, Steven and Sharon Rowe of Hartsville, SC, David L. and Virginia Rowe of Raleigh, NC; daughters and sons-in-law, Elizabeth "Lisa" and Gary Ray of Corona, CA, Judith and Tim Britt of Spartanburg, SC; sister, Velda Seiferheld of Louisville, KY. She was preceded in death by her infant son, Phillip Rowe.
