



Frank Cox

November 13, 1921 - August 2, 2007

LTC Frank Albert Cox, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers retired, entered into eternal rest on August 2, 2007. Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Tuesday, August 7, 2007 at the Brown-Pennington-Atkins Chapel with visitation following the service. Burial will in the Florence National Cemetery at 3:00 p.m. Memorials may be made to the National Audubon Society, Dept. W, 700 Broadway, New York, NY 10003 or a charity of your choice.

Born November 13, 1921, he was the son of the late Edward and Elizabeth Cox of High Bridge, NJ. He attended High Bridge High School and Newark College of Engineering. He entered the U.S. Army March 4, 1942, being commissioned as a Second Lieutenant April 28, 1942. His assignments included the 112th Combat Engineers in Europe from 1943-1946, the 64th Engineers Topographic Battalion in Japan from 1948-1952, the 2nd Combat Engineers in Korea 1954-1956, the 20th Combat Engineers of 2nd Infantry, and 1st Infantry, 30th Topographic Engineers, and Army Map Service. LTC Cox was awarded the Good Conduct Medal, Army Commendation Medal, American Theater Medal, European-African Middle Eastern Theater Medal with arrowhead and five campaign stars, Occupation Medal, Korean Service Medal, United Nations Medal, Nation Defense Service Medal, and Presidential Unit Citations.

After retiring from the U.S. Army in 1964, LTC Cox worked for a Defense Contractor, before moving to Florida and then Texas, finally settling in Hartsville, SC.

Surviving are his wife of 61 years, Reba Crider Cox of Hartsville; son and daughter-in-law, Lee and Lynne Cox of Hartsville, SC; granddaughter and spouse, Jennifer and Mark Jacobs of Hartsville, SC; grandson, Kenneth Cox of Hartsville, SC; great-granddaughter, Mackenzie Jacobs, and great-grandson, Ryyder Jacobs, both of Hartsville, SC; brother-in-law, Herbert Havelka of Owensville, Mo; sister-in law, Eleanor McCarter of Asheville, NC; nephews, David Hunter of Moorhead City, NC, Douglas Havelka of St. Louis, MO, Steven Havelka of Owensville, MO, Daniel Barker of Potosi, MO, and John R Baker of St. Clair, MO.
