



## Harry Frampton

Harry Hastings Frampton, Jr., of Hartsville, died Wednesday, November 18. Born in Hartsville, he was the son of the late Harry H. Frampton, Sr. and Vivian Griffis Frampton. He was a graduate of Davidson College where he played varsity tennis and was a member of Sigma Epsilon Fraternity.

Mr. Frampton was a commissioned officer in World War II, serving four years in the Navy. He was in the retail business for twenty-five years before working for the Darlington County School District as Director of Federal Programs. He was a life-long member of the First Presbyterian Church where he served as an officer, and he was a charter member and first president of the Hartsville Exchange Club. An avid sports enthusiast, he was instrumental in organizing the Hartsville Red Fox Club and the Little League Baseball program. He coached Little League Baseball for many years.

Surviving are his wife, Barbara Kalber Frampton; a son, Harry H. Frampton, III of Vail, CO; two daughters, Ms. Carrie Frampton Thompson of Mt. Pleasant, and Mrs. Bib Frampton Willis of Quincy, CA; grandchildren, Christopher Edgar Frampton, David Erwin Thompson, Matthew Hastings Frampton, Harry Frampton Thompson, Barbara Kalber Moses, Ryan J. Frampton Willis, and Tahlah Lou Willis.
