June 10, 1917 - February 5, 2006

Hattie Myers, a former resident of Sligo and Clarion, PA, and wife of the late Vernon Myers, died February 5, 2006. Funeral services will be held at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, February 7, 2006 at the Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Home Chapel with a visitation following the service. The Rev. Tony Medlin will officiate.

Funeral services will also be held in Sligo, PA at 11:00 a.m. Saturday, February 11, 2005 at the Monroe Chapel United Methodist Church with a visitation Friday from 2 – 4 p.m. and 7 – 9 p.m. at the Varner Funeral Home.
