



## Mr. Heyward Furman Galloway Jr.

November 15, 1930 - July 23, 2017

Heyward Furman Galloway Jr, 86, of Charlotte NC, passed away Sunday, July 23rd, 2017 at University Place Nursing & Rehab Center in Charlotte. Born in Hartsville, SC on November 15th, 1931, he was the son of Mary Eva Eddins Galloway and Heyward Furman Galloway, Sr.

He was a 1949 graduate of Hartsville High School where he was a member of the football team. Furman graduated from Clemson University in 1953, a proud member of the "Senior Platoon," the University's crack drill team. Throughout his life he remained faithful to the Clemson University Alumni Association. He had been a continuing supporter and benefactor of the Clemson University Foundation. The title of "Golden Tiger" was conferred upon him by the Clemson University Alumni Association on June 14th, 2003.

Following graduation from Clemson, Furman served as an officer in the United States Army. He was stationed at Fort Hood, TX as an Armor Officer. After his military service he returned to Spartanburg, SC and worked with Milliken Industries for over 40 years. Furman is remembered with great respect and admiration by fellow employees for his expertise in plant operations and developing quality control initiatives. Following retirement, he continued to meet routinely with other retired Milliken associates and school classmates.

Surviving are a brother, William Eddins (Jeannette) Galloway of Union, SC; a sister, Betty Galloway (Peter) Mulford of Martinsburg WV; a stepdaughter,

Sharon Cooke Padgett (Scott) of Charlotte NC; and eight nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Ruth Byrd Galloway; his brother, Joseph Albert Galloway; and stepdaughter, Patti Annick Cooke.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, July 29th at 11:00 a.m. in the Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Home Chapel in Hartsville SC. Visitation will follow immediately after the service.

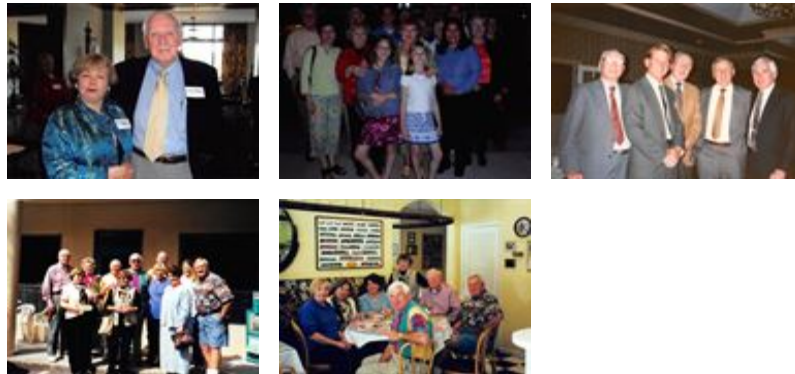
