January 18, 1911 - November 10, 2005

Janet Porter White, widow of Charles Warner White, and mother of four children, six grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren, died peacefully at her home at Well Spring Retirement Community on the evening of November 10, 2005. She was 94 years old.

Services for Janet White will be held at 2 PM, on Wednesday, November 16 at the First Presbyterian Church in Hartsville, SC. The Rev. Dr. Mac Doubles will officiate and Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Home is in charge. There will be a private burial next to her husband at the Magnolia Cemetery. A memorial service officiated by The Reverend John S. Akers, III will be held at a future date at the Well Spring Retirement Community in Greensboro, NC.

Janet Eleanor Porter was born January 18, 1911 in Leominster, Mass. She graduated from Dana Hall School for Women and then Garland College in Boston, MA. In 1934 she married Charles W. White.

She and her husband moved their family to Hartsville as he began a career with Sonoco Products Company in 1956. Janet became an active member of the First Presbyterian Church participating in a variety of volunteer activities for her church and the community. She was active in the Women's Auxiliary for the First Presbyterian Church and was an enthusiastic member of the

Hartsville Garden Club, Friends of the Library, the Meals-On-Wheels program and the Thursday Study Club, among others.

In 1994, she moved to the Well Spring Retirement Community, Greensboro, NC, and transferred her church affiliation to the First Presbyterian Church in Greensboro. At Well Spring she continued to actively participate in visitations and other programs.
