



Lt. Col. Judson Carey Segars

January 22, 1915 - April 1, 2015

Funeral services for Chaplain Judson Carey Segars, 100, who died peacefully on Wednesday, April 1, 2015, will be held at 2 o'clock on Monday, April 13, 2015 at Kelleytown Baptist Church. The Rev. He began his military career September 1942 and served our country for 27 years including 2 years in combat in World War II plus duty in Korea, Panama, and Germany. He was a missionary-at-large for all of his life starting in elementary school. He was known for giving out witnessing leaflets to anyone and everyone, as well as helping others through his efforts, prayers, and money.

He is survived by his daughter, Carole Waina of Dallas TX; granddaughter, Laura Hasty of Dallas, TX; grandson Andrew Segars of Almaty, Kazakhstan, grandson Philip Waina of Washington, D.C., grandsons Timothy Segars and
