She graduated from Florence High School in 1937 and Winthrop College in 1941. She taught 33 years in Chesterfield and Darlington County Schools and was a lifetime member of SCEA and NEA. She was a member of McBee United Methodist Church, the UMW, taught many years of Sunday School, and directed and sang in the choir. Mrs. King was as an active member of WIFE that was founded in Bishopville and SC State Farm Bureau. During the last seven years of her life, she resided at the United Methodist Manner of the Pee Dee in Florence, SC. She was an active member of the choir and volunteered in the Reminisce Gift Shoppe.

She loved watching her grandchildren play sports, cheer and march in the

band as well as cheering on the Clemson Tigers.
