



## Mr. Marvin Lee Davidson

August 20, 1936 - February 25, 2025

It is with deep sorrow that the Davidson family announces the death of Mr. Marvin Lee Davidson, 88, of Cheraw.

Mr. Davidson entered into rest at his residence, surrounded by his loving family, on Tuesday, February 25, 2025. The Directors of Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Home & Crematory are caring for the family.

A graveside funeral service to honor his life will be held at one o'clock on March 7, 2025, in Florence National Cemetery. Pastor Benj Melton will officiate.

Mr. Davidson was born on Thursday, August 20th, 1936, in Obion County, TN. He is the son of John Davidson and Pearl Lynch Davidson. He served in the United States Air Force during the Korean War and also worked as a Deputy Sheriff for St. Clair County, Illinois. After his colorful career, he retired to the state of Florida, where he then became the Volunteer Fire Chief for Richland Fire Department.
