



Mrs. Nettie Faye DeFoor Kilpatrick

March 8, 1935 - June 24, 2021

A celebration of the life of Mrs. Nettie Faye DeFoor Kilpatrick, 86, who entered into rest on Thursday, June 24, 2021, will be held at 11 o'clock on Monday, June 28, 2021, in The Chapel of Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Home. The Rev. Kevin Walters and The Rev. Eric McCreary will assist the family and burial will follow in Magnolia Cemetery. The family will receive friends one hour prior to the service. Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Directors are caring for the family.

In lieu of flowers, the family requests that donations be made to the Andy Kilpatrick Memorial Scholarship, a fund set up after Andy's death that awards a deserving senior of Hartsville High School who will continue his or her education. Nettie was very proud of this scholarship since she believed it helped keep Andy's memory alive while helping others -- The Andy Kilpatrick Memorial Scholarship, The Citizens Bank, c/o Ben Kilpatrick, P.O. "Wear your life jacket" and "put on your sunscreen" were just two of the too-many-to-mention life lessons Nettie DeFoor Kilpatrick gave to her children and grandchildren during her life, which ended on June 24, 2021.

Nettie, born on March 8, 1935, was one of seven children to Carrie Lee Kidd and Harley Cornelius DeFoor, near Haleyville, AL. Although she lived most of

her life in South Carolina, Alabama remained one of her favorite places, and she loved spending time with her numerous siblings and their spouses as well as her many nephews and nieces.

A chance encounter in Haleyville with U.S. Army veteran and Haleyville native Ben Kilpatrick led to a courtship and eventually marriage in 1956. She moved to Columbia, S.C., where Ben was completing his bachelor's degree at the University of South Carolina. There they had their first child, Tammy, in 1959. Following Ben's graduation, the couple moved to Hartsville, S.C., where Ben began working for Sonoco Products Company, eventually becoming a regional manager until his retirement in 1990. Nettie, too, worked at Sonoco until 1963, when the couple had their second child, Andy.

Nettie had many interests, one of which was tennis. Through hours of practice with friends at the city courts at Lawton Park, Nettie taught herself to play the sport, later participating in lessons at both Prestwood Country Club and the Hartsville Country Club. She became a fierce competitor, whether it was singles or doubles, and she was particularly proud of her wicked drop shot. She made some of her closest friends playing tennis; whether it was a once-a-week group or playing in a USTA league, Nettie loved tennis.

Although age may have slowed her down, her passion for the game remained strong, and she often took her grandchildren, Connor, Julie, and Mia, to the courts to hit a few balls. With the advent of cable television and its diverse offerings, the Tennis Channel became an entertainment staple on any given evening.

She also watched local and network news to stay abreast of current events, becoming famous in the family for saying "we have to keep up with what's happening in the world," and offered an endless supply of snacks for her grandchildren when they needed cheering up.

And when the summer heat precluded a tennis match, Nettie could be found at the Prestwood Country Club pool, nearby Lake Robinson, or on the beach at Ocean Isle, N.C., children — and later grandchildren — in tow, teaching them the finer points of swimming and telling them not to go too deep. She also helped teach “half of Hartsville,” as Ben likes to say, how to ski through her pointers -- even though she didn’t ski herself.

Besides outside activities, Nettie was an avid bridge player, but she also enjoyed a variety of card games with her children and grandchildren such as Uno, rummy, and crazy eights.

Along with Ben, Nettie became a loyal fan of the University of South Carolina Gamecocks, attending countless numbers of football and basketball games, but cheering them on regardless of the sport. Both her children and two of her grandchildren graduated from USC, and when granddaughter Mia chose Wofford College to continue her undergraduate education, Nettie became a Terrier fan as well.

Aside from sports, Nettie was extremely active in her community. She was a troop leader in the Girl Scouts, engaging in camping trips and displaying in her girls the joys and benefits of serving others. She was willing to take the girls anywhere -- camping at the beach, hiking at the state park, climbing Sugarloaf Mountain. Whether it was teaching the girls to sew “sit-upons” to get credit for a badge or helping them make their own pinata out of paper mache (which was so well-crafted that it would not break and had to have the candy poured out of the hole at the top), she put in the extra time to make sure the girls were accomplishing new skills while having fun learning them.

Her desire to help her community carried over to her volunteer work for the

Hospital Auxiliary, starting at Byerly Hospital and continuing after its move to Carolina Pines Regional Medical Center.

Nettie never met a stranger. In social gatherings, restaurants, or other sites where crowds gathered, she always struck up a conversation with people she didn't know and somehow found a connection related to acquaintances or family. Six degrees of separation? Try one or two, tops.

Most importantly, Nettie was a devout Christian with an unwavering faith in her Lord Jesus Christ. She attended the Gregg Avenue Church of Christ in Florence, S.C. for many years before attending services closer to home at the Hartsville Church of Christ.

She was surrounded by her loving family at the time of her passing. She is survived by Ben, her husband of 65 years; daughter Tammy Watkins of Mount Pleasant, SC; son-in-law Jeff Watkins of Mount Pleasant; beloved grandchildren Connor Watkins and Julie Watkins, both of Lexington, S.C. and Mia Kilpatrick of Hartsville; sisters Doris Lillard of Huntsville, AL and Era Martin of Bryan, Ohio; brother-in-law Gip Kilpatrick of Haleyville, Ala., and sister-in-law Patsy Rayfield of Mobile, Ala.; and numerous nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her son Andy, her parents, and siblings Eldon DeFoor, LV Cagle, Kermit DeFoor, and Verna Jacks.

The family extends their deepest appreciation and admiration to the numerous caregivers who showered Nettie with care and compassion during her final days, including the nurses and doctors at McLeod Hospice House.

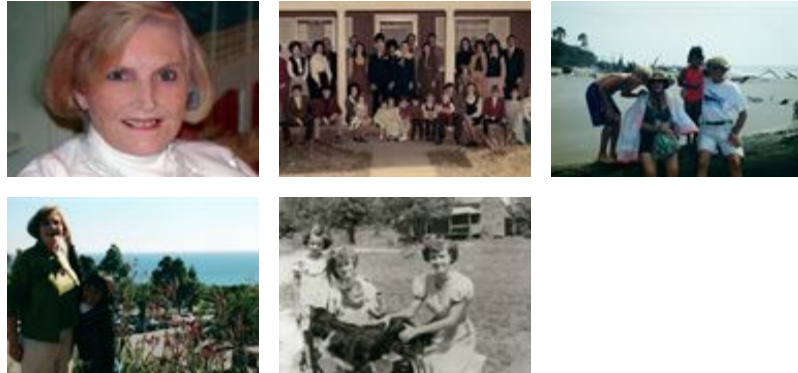
