Mrs. Sandy Strehlow Haarlow, 74, of Pinehurst, N.C. died suddenly Wednesday evening, May 29, 2019, in Moore Memorial Hospital with her family by her side. A celebration honoring her life will be held from 1:00 until 3:00 pm on Saturday, June 15, 2019, at The Pinehurst Resort & Country Club - Pinehurst No. 9 Clubhouse. A private burial will be held. Brown-Pennington-Atkins Funeral Home is caring for the family.

She married Bob Haarlow in 1966, and after brief stays in Honolulu and Kansas City, she moved to the Sandhills area of North Carolina in 1971 where she spent the remaining forty-eight years of her life.

Sandy worshipped at Brownson Presbyterian Church in Southern Pines and was a member of the Pinehurst Country Club where she could often be seen swimming or hitting golf balls. For more than twenty-five years, Sandy was a successful realtor with ReMax Prime Properties. She loved meeting people

and helping them move into what she considered to be the ideal community in which to live.
